MarineNet Courses

Range Safety - RTAMRSOCAA

This course will serve as the primary method to certify Basic Level Officers-incharge (OIC) and Range Safety Officers (RSO) within the Marine Corps. Course must be successfully completed prior to receiving local/regional range safety training and certification as a live fire Range Safety Officer or Officer-in-charge.

Range Laser Safety – RTAMLRSOAA

The Range Laser Safety course serves as a primary method to certify Laser Range Safety Officers (LRSO) for Range Laser Operations in the Marine Corps. The lesson focuses on the cognitive skills and knowledge base that a LRSO needs to safely and correctly supervise range laser operations for live-fire training events.

 For all laser use, a Laser Range Safety Officer (LRSO) is required in addition to the standard OIC/RSO qualifications.

Proctor Certification Course - MNET0110PC

Successful completion of this course is required to certify individuals to serve as proctors, responsible for monitoring students as they take MarineNet course exams.
