PERSONAL PROFILE

Cpl. Chischilly joined the Marine Corps in May 2005 as a 0311 rifleman. He served with 1st Battalion, 7th Marines, out of 29 Palms, Calif. He completed three combat tours to Iraq in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom. Cpl. Chischilly reenlisted to 3rd Battalion, 5th Marines, based out of San Mateo, Camp Pendleton. He later completed a tour to Korea and a combat tour to Afghanistan in support of Operation Enduring Freedom. On October 9, 2010, he was severely injured by an improvised explosive device (IED), resulting in the loss of his left leg above the knee and severe shrapnel wounds to his arms and other leg. After two years of intense recovery care at the Naval Medical Center San Diego, he was temporarily assigned to VMFAT-101 assuming the MOS 6048 flight equipment technician. Cpl. Chischilly is scheduled to retire this year. He has a wife, Antania, and three children.

Cpl. Chischilly is currently with Wounded Warrior Battalion-West (WWBn-W), living in San Diego and working on his transition out of the military. The hardest part of his recovery has been reconnecting with himself and his family while maintaining and learning true mental toughness. What has had the greatest impact on his recovery has been participating in competitive adaptive sports and the continuing support of his wife and WWBn-W. What he enjoys about the Warrior Games is the camaraderie between his fellow Marines and the intense training and competition.
