## PERSONAL PROFILE

Cpl. Hennagir joined the Marine Corps in July 2004 as a 1371 Combat Engineer. He served with the 2nd Combat Engineer Battalion (CEB), based out of Camp Lejeune, N.C.. During his three years of serving with 2nd CEB, he deployed to Fallujah, Iraq, twice. During his second deployment, Cpl. Hennagir was injured by an improvised explosive device resulting in the immediate amputation of both legs above the knee, and leaving only his thumb on his left hand.

Cpl. Hennagir currently lives in Orlando, Fla. He plays wheelchair basketball with the Orlando Magic Wheels. The hardest part of his recovery has been relearning how to use his new limbs. Basketball has had the greatest impact on his recovery by getting him back into a competitive mindset. What he enjoys about the Warrior Games is that it allows warrior athletes to feel like warriors again.
