U.S. v. Gunnery Sgt. Jason G. Hernandez, Quantico, Va.

Sept. 3, 2015

At a special court-martial at Quantico, Va., Gunnery Sgt. Jason G. Hernandez was convicted by a panel of members with enlisted representation of showing disrespect towards a superior commissioned officer. The panel of members sentenced the accused to reduction to E-6.

U.S. v. Lance Cpl. Travonta A. Stephens, Quantico, Va.

Sept. 10, 2015

At a general court-martial at Quantico, Va., Lance Cpl. Travonta A. Stephens was convicted by a military judge for attempted assault of a child and violating a lawful general order. The military judge sentenced the accused to a dishonorable discharge, reduction to E-1, total forfeitures, sex offender registration, and 26 months of confinement. Pursuant to a pretrial agreement the confinement was restricted to 18 months.

U.S. v. Cpl. Alejandro A. Flores-Gastelum, Quantico, Va.

Sept. 11, 2015

At a general court-martial at Quantico, Va., Cpl. Alejandro A. Flores-Gastelum was convicted by a military judge for attempted sexual abuse of a child. The military judge sentenced the accused to a dishonorable discharge, reduction to E-1, 1 year confinement, and sex offender registration. Pursuant to a pretrial agreement the automatic forfeitures will be deferred from the effecting date and paid by dependent allotment.

U.S. v. Sgt. Cameron S. Deane, Miramar, California

Sept. 28, 2015

At a special court-martial at Quantico, Va., Sgt. Cameron S. Deane was convicted by a military judge for willful dereliction of duty, false official statement, and larceny. The military judge sentence the accused to a bad conduct discharge, reduction to E-1, and confinement of 165 days. The pretrial agreement in this case did not affect the sentence.
