

Certification for Marine Corps Personnel

STEP 1:

The primary requirement to become certified as an OIC/RSO is to complete the USMC Range Safety Course and successfully complete the proctored exam at the end of the course. Once complete, bring a copy of the certificate to the MCB Quantico installation range safety program (OIC/RSO) brief. To begin, just click MarineNet link on the RMB website.

STEP 2:

Upon completion of the USMC Range Safety Course, you are next required to attend the MCB Quantico Installation OIC/RSO brief. The brief is held twice a month unless otherwise noted. Refer to the RMB website for schedule.

Attendees must bring the following to the brief:

- Copy of USMC Range Safety Course certificate
- Copy of the MCB Quantico Installation OIC/RCO brief.
- Copy of MCBO 3570.1A in either hard copy or viewable electronic copy on a personal device.

STEP 3:

After completing both Range Safety Courses and their exams, the last step is to be appointed in writing by your unit Commander. This Appointment Letter gives Range Management Branch the confidence that the OIC is knowledgeable in the weapon systems and the RSO is weapon systems qualified for the weapons they will be responsible for on the ranges they use to train.

MarineNet Courses

Range Safety – RTAMRSOCAA

This course will serve as the primary method to certify Basic Level Officers-in-charge (OIC) and Range Safety Officers (RSO) within the Marine Corps. Course must be successfully completed prior to receiving local/regional range safety training and certification as a live fire Range Safety Officer or Officer-in-charge.

Range Laser Safety – RTAMLRSOAA

The Range Laser Safety course serves as a primary method to certify Laser Range Safety Officers (LRSO) for Range Laser Operations in the Marine Corps. The lesson focuses on the cognitive skills and knowledge base that a LRSO needs to safely and correctly supervise range laser operations for live-fire training events.

In order to become certified as an Officer in Charge (OIC) or Range Safety Officer (RSO) for Marine Corps Base Quantico, Marine Corps and Base Regulations mandate the completion of essential training in range safety, policy and procedures, and range and training area regulations specific to the installation.

Attaining Certification for All Others

STEP 1:

Complete the USMC Range Safety course on MarineNet and successfully complete the proctored exam.

All non-Marine Corps personnel must go to MarineNet and request an account in order to complete this requirement.

Units are encouraged to have their training sections request proctor accounts to administer the test at their unit.

Military and DoD employees should not have an issue gaining immediate access.
