1. Situation. To promulgate policy, procedures, and responsibilities consistent with the references for the conduct of the readiness inspections within Marine Corps Installations National Capital Region-Marine Corps Base Quantico (MCINCR-MCBQ) / Security Battalion construct.

2. Mission. Establish policy for MCINCR-MCBQ Directors, Special Staff, and the subordinate command, Security Battalion, pertaining to the Inspector General of the Marine Corps (IGMC) Inspection Checklist responsibilities and establish a timeline for off-cycle internal inspections and site assist visits.

3. Execution

a. Commander's Intent and Concept of Operations

(1) Commander's Intent. Establish policy that provides the framework for an efficient and effective internal inspection program, by empowering subordinate leaders through the manning and training of Functional Area Managers to conduct their duties in a proficient and professional manner, and to provide the requisite oversight for effective inspection program management.

(2) Concept of Operations. A well-disciplined unit is the foundation for effective operational capabilities. Therefore, MCINCR-MCBQ will institute an internal inspection program that reinforces discipline as it promotes effectiveness, economy, efficiency, quality of life, and enhanced readiness. It will prevent and / or detect fraud waste, and abuse of authority, mismanagement, prohibited activities and conduct, and related improprieties. Given the unique command relationship that exists between MCINCR-MCBQ and its administrative support unit, Security Battalion, the management and execution of all functional areas will be a collaborative effort. Enclosure (1) identifies each functional area and its associated manager.

b. Tasks

(1) Chief of Staff MCINCR-MCBQ

(a) Serve as the overall supervisor of the MCINCR-MCBQ Command Internal Inspection Program.

(b) Conduct quarterly reviews of the Command Internal Inspection Program and provide the Commander with a status of the program.

(2) Commanding Officer, Security Battalion

(a) Assign functional area subject matter experts, including MCINCR-MCBQ Headquarters Staff and Security Battalion Staff, to serve as Functional Area Managers for the functional areas under the cognizance of this command.

(b) Coordinate with G-1 for the completion of appointment letters that are signed by Commander, MCINCR-MCBQ.

(c) Provide a consolidated functional area manager list to the Chief of Staff, with updates when personnel changes occur.

(d) Establish an internal inspection program that ensures each functional area is compliant with all orders, directives, and policies.

(e) Establish a Staff Assist Visits (SAV) Program that supports the internal inspections schedule, ensuring each functional area is evaluated by a subject matter expert from outside of MCINCR-MCBQ/Security Battalion.

(f) Brief the Chief of Staff MCINCR-MCBQ on the results of all internal inspections and SAVs.

(g) Coordinate semi-annually with the Command Inspector General to validate that all CoRE, CoRE+, and Non-Core Functional Areas are identified and assigned Functional Area Managers.

(3) Functional Area Managers

(a) Establish and maintain procedures that ensure assigned functional areas are effective.

(b) Maintain an internal inspection / audit of your functional area that supports the overall effectiveness of the Command's Internal Inspection Program.

(c) Functional Area Managers that are listed on enclosure (1) as "Dual Appointment" will be appointed in writing by both the MCINCR-MCBQ Commander and

Security Battalion Commander, when required by the Functional Area Checklist. Dual appointment is intended to gain efficiencies in personnel assignments, ensure synchronization of program objectives at both levels of command, and ensure appropriate subject matter experts are managing essential programs throughout the command.

(4) Assistant Chiefs of Staff MCINCR-MCBQ. Assist the Chief of Staff and Commanding Officer, Security Battalion in the execution and maintenance of the Command Internal Inspection Program and provide subject matter expertise as directed.

4. Administration and Logistics

a. Administration

(1) Ensure distribution of this Order to all elements within the MCINCR-MCBQ Staff and Security Battalion.

(2) Current Functional Area Checklists are updated regularly and are available through the IGMC web site at: <https://www.igmc.marines.mil/Divisions/Inspections-Division/Functional-Area-Checklists-FACs/>. Functional Area Managers and Inspectors shall regularly check the website to ensure they have the most current checklist.

b. Logistics. Not applicable.

5. Command and Signal

a. Command. This Order is applicable to MCINCR-MCBQ, Security Battalion, and all subordinate elements.

b. Signal. This Order is effective the date it is signed.
