RECREATION AREA

1. Situation. Access into the Lunga Park and Recreation Area is restricted due to the presence of unexploded military munitions. This Marine Corps Installations National Capital Region-Marine Corps Base Quantico (MCINCR-MCBQ) Bulletin provides guidance and instructions to all personnel aboard the installation concerning these restrictions.

2. Mission. Commander MCINCR-MCBQ, via the Natural Resources and Environmental Affairs Branch, Naval Facilities Engineering Command, Safety Division, Marine Corps Systems Command (MARCORSYSCOM), State Environmental Agencies, and the Federal Environmental Protection Agency, has initiated an Environmental Restoration Project, under the Military Munitions Response Program (MMRP), in order to remediate Lunga Park and Recreation Area.

3. Execution

a. Commander's Intent and Concept of Operations

(1) Commander's Intent. To preserve the health and welfare of the general public and Base personnel while restoring the Lunga Park and Recreation Area as a viable recreation asset.

(2) Concept of Operations. Until further notice, access to Lunga Park and Recreation Area is prohibited for anyone not associated with the MMRP. Entry into this area by unauthorized personnel is a significant safety and health risk and would disrupt Unexploded Ordnance (UXO) removal activities.

(a) The land use restrictions are categorized into the following four categories:

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1. Safety Perimeter. This outer boundary is established to preserve proper stand-off distance. The perimeter is indicated as a green or brown line on the map in Enclosure (1) and will be physically marked by fencing and signage. Only those individuals directly working within the installation's restoration project are permitted beyond this point.

2. Ground Remediation Zones (UXO 34, UXO 38, UXO 39). These boundaries are established to provide systematic clean-up zones to the MMRP personnel for surface lands, allowing for the prioritization of the remediation planning. These zones are representative of areas located around and within the Lunga Park and Recreation Area. As the clean-up is accomplished, the determination to re-open specific areas will be based on the Commander's decision, clean-up actions in other areas, and in conjunction with MARCORSYSCOM.

3. Water Remediation Zone (UXO 35). This boundary is established to provide clean-up requirements of submerged lands within the Lunga Reservoir to the MMRP personnel. Indicated by the orange lines in Enclosure (1), this zone is representative of land below the water line of the reservoir itself. As the clean-up is accomplished, the determination to re-open specific areas will be based on the Commander's decision, clean-up actions in other areas, and in conjunction with MARCORSYSCOM.

4. Lunga Reservoir Active Range Area. This boundary is a pre-existing land use restriction for those areas of the Lunga Reservoir within active military ranges. These water zones are currently managed by Range Management Branch (G-3).

(b) UXO contractors who are part of the MMRP are permitted full access to this area for work-related purposes. Government Program Managers responsible for oversight of the MMRP may coordinate access through the UXO contractor or the Base Explosives Safety Officer (ESO) at commercial (703) 432-1092, as applicable.

(c) Limited use of the roads through Lunga Park and Recreation Area may be permitted for military training purposes, limited activities by Marine Corps Community Services (MCCS), and other official government business. These actions must be coordinated and approved by the Base ESO. If approved, these operations are limited to use that will not conflict with UXO removal operations.

(d) The Base ESO and the Natural Resources and Environmental Affairs Branch (G-F) will coordinate with Range Management Branch (G-3) and the UXO contractor concerning access to UXO 38 and UXO 39. Access will be granted in writing by the Base ESO, and the grantee must have the approval letter in possession at all times while inside the safety perimeter.

(e) Periodic checks of this area by Base law enforcement personnel may be conducted, with prior coordination and approval by the Base ESO.

(f) Failure to comply with the requirements of this Bulletin will be considered as trespassing into a restricted area, and violators will be subject to appropriate disciplinary and/or enforcement action under 50 U.S.C. 797 or the Uniform Code of Military Justice, as applicable.

4. Administration and Logistics. None.

5. Command and Signal.

a. Command. This bulletin is applicable to all personnel aboard MCINCR-MCBQ. Please contact the Provost Marshall Office, at (703) 784-2252, to report any violation of this Bulletin.

b. Signal. All land use restrictions are effective the date signed.



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
