

COMMANDING OFFICER'S POLICY ON READINESS



MCO 1754.9B states the purpose of the Unit, Personal, and Family Readiness Program (UPFRP) is to support Marine Corps units and family readiness by providing a link between commanders, Marines, Sailors, Civilians, Contractors, and family members. The UPFRP enables unit members and their family members to navigate the challenges of daily life, in the context of military service, enabling commanders to focus on creating ready units.

The UPFRP equips personnel and their families with the knowledge and tools necessary to successfully meet the challenges of the unit's mission. It is an essential element to build resiliency and morale, while enabling an increase in overall unit readiness. It leverages communication, resource support, and volunteer management to create a program that supports all Marines, Sailors, Civilians, and Contractors of Security Battalion; whether married or single.

The Family Readiness Command Team (FRCT) will remain committed to ensuring the successful execution of the UPFRP. Senior enlisted leaders, Single Marine Program representatives, and other volunteers will ensure the UPFRP accounts for the concerns of our married and single members. The inclusion of input from our Civilians and Contractors will enable us to incorporate the interests of the other half of Security Battalion's personnel, when applicable.

The establishment of a comprehensive UPFRP is essential to sustain the force. One of the most critical elements for a successful program is participation. Members of the battalion are expected to actively take part in the program and its initiatives, in order to ensure its applicability to all personnel. Maintaining an up-to-date and inclusive UPFRP will ensure Security Battalion maintains a ready force that is capable of meeting all mission requirements at a moment's notice.
